2 Frankly, the 30(b)(6) issue has been a very difficult one in
3 this case.

4 Here is the deal. Bayer will either bring this guy to
5 St. Louis the week of May 11th, or make him available somewhere
6 the following week, and maybe if you offer a Sunday or a
7 Saturday, that's okay, but that's it, so, whatever you have to
8 do, either the week of May 11th in St. Louis, and I have no
9 doubt that Ms. Garrison can be brought up to speed to take this

5 your numbers. Some of the cases are not producer cases. I'm
6 not counting those because your order pertained to producer
7 cases. So Mr. Olson and I have discussed that rather -- we
8 have exchanged our selections for the other two jurisdictions
9 as the Court ordered. We wanted to talk with Your Honor before
10 we did any selections for that district.

11 My thought would be to treat that district like we
12 treated the other districts and make that only in a next wave
13 of selections. I think our thought when we proposed the order
14 to Your Honor, let's deal with the jurisdictions that have the
15 vast majority of cases first and get those in the first wave,
16 and I don't think the Eastern District of Arkansas really falls
17 into that category, and I'm sorry, and I'm sure Mr. Olson feels
18 the same way for proposing that to you.

19 THE COURT: So Mr. Olson, is that what you think you
20 should do, wait and do it in the next wave?

21 MR. OLSON: Yes.

22 THE COURT: Okay. That's easy. Done. Is
23 Mr. Phipps on the line or here?

1 plaintiffs' individual experts, so we would like to extend that
2 date by a week to June 19th to complete those individual expert
3 depositions.

4 The final change would be for the date for defendants to
5 disclose their individual expert witnesses. We're extending
6 that to July 2nd.

7 THE COURT: Okay.

8 MR. LUECKENHOFF: That's about a week, Your Honor.

9 THE COURT: The deposition on that remains the same?

10 MR. LUECKENHOFF: Yes, Your Honor.

11 THE COURT: That's fine. I don't know if I'll put
12 that in an order or not. I approve your agreement, so you all
13 made a record of what it is. I don't want to screw it up by
14 putting it in an order, but I may do that, I'm not sure.

15 Item 4 on your list was the possibility of including
16 initial Texas cases in the initial group of remanded cases.
17 Right now we've got -- the CMO says that 30 Southern District
18 of Texas cases will be in the first group, and so what is your
19 proposed change?

20 MR. DOWNING: Clay SmaistrLa is on the phone to
21 discuss that on the plaintiff's side.

22 MR. SMAISTRLA: This is Clayton SmaistrLa
23 representing individual rice farmers which are Texas
24 plaintiffs, and what we did --

25 THE COURT: Speak up just a little, Mr. SmaistrLa.

1 MR. SMAISTRILA: Absolutely. Can you hear me better?

2 THE COURT: Yes.

3 MR. SMAISTRILA: What happened was that we initially
4 designated ten cases to be submitted to the trial pool, the
5 initial trial pool for Texas cases. The agreement was that
6 Bayer would also submit ten cases. What happened was that
7 there was some overlap, and so I believe we got basically 17
8 out of the 20 cases of the ones that we proposed and Bayer
9 proposed. What we were wanting to do, there was two additional
10 cases we would like to have submitted into the initial trial
11 pool, and Mr. Olson and I were trying to get in touch and talk
12 about this before the status conference today, but we were
13 playing phone tag and couldn't get a hold of each other, so
14 this may not be an issue, I'm not sure what Bayer's position on
15 it is, but there are two cases that we propose be added to that
16 initial trial pool.

17 THE COURT: Are you talking about initial trial pool
18 or initial group of remands?

19 MR. SMAISTRILA: Initial remands.

20 THE COURT: From Bayer?

21 MR. OLSON: Eric Olson again. Our view is we should
22 follow the CMO, each pick ten from the Southern District of
23 Texas. There was some overlap. The CMO does not contemplate
24 going back and adding more to the pile. My concern is I've
25 slept a lot since I picked those ten cases, and the data source

1 that I had organized and used in my selection is no longer
2 current. It would be a fair bit of administrative work on my
3 end to go back, and I guess Mr. Smaistrle's proposal is they
4 pick two and we pick one to bring it up to 20, even, but I
5 think it's unnecessary work. There is another phase of
6 remanded cases to be picked, and we should just add those at
7 that time. I don't know that it's worth everyone's time to go
8 back when there is an overlap because this may happen again to
9 fill in more cases to make sure we get 20. We each had ten
10 selections and we exercised those ten selections.

11 THE COURT: Mr. Smaistrle, are there two specific --
12 is there any reason besides having the full group that you wish
13 to add these?

14 MR. SMAISTRLE: Yeah, there's two cases that we feel
15 would be beneficial to have in that initial group of cases that
16 are remanded, and actually, one of the things that I proposed
17 to Mr. Olson was that if it would be more fair to us to both
18 propose two, and if the Court approves that, then just we each
19 pick two and we have 21 of the cases then.

20 THE COURT: Okay, I'm going to allow that, Mr.
21 Olson, over your objection, so you can each pick two additional
22 cases to go into the pool.

23 MR. OLSON: Can I get some relief given other expert
24 report deadlines? I would like three weeks.

25 THE COURT: Okay. So when do you need?

1 MR. OLSON: I don't have my calendar open here.
2 June 12th.

3 THE COURT: Okay, so each side will pick two
4 additional cases by June 12th.

5 MR. OLSON: If for some reason we come up with less
6 than four, we leave it as is, correct?

7 THE COURT: Right. That's as far as we're going to
8 go.

9 MR. SMAISTRLA: Thank you, Judge.

10 MR. OLSON: Thank you, Your Honor.

11 THE COURT: I have some issues I want to talk to you
12 about in addition. Then at the end, I'm going to ask you all
13 if there is anything else you want to talk about, but there is
14 pending in the VT case a motion to test the samples from the
15 barges that will destroy some rice, and it says it's not
16 objected to by Producers, I think this is an issue between VT
